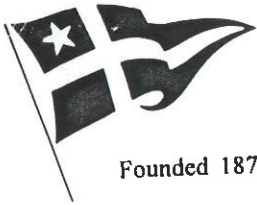


## ***CHARLES DEER WIMAN MEMORIAL***

I believe it is in the Deed of Gift and I believe it should represent the Cup itself, but please check on this.

MEMORANDUM

CONCERNING THE WIMAN TROPHY FUND

September 3, 1974

On this date, I discussed in some detail with Mrs. Wiman her wishes concerning the use of her Wiman Trophy Fund.

When it is necessary to add more base to the major permanent, stay at the Club, Wiman Trophy, and as it is necessary to add another band or facility to place additional names, it is her wish that the interest from her fund be used for this purpose.

When we do run out of take-home trophies, it is Mrs. Wiman's wish that we use the interest from her funds to continue to purchase and give beautiful take-home trophies each Labor Day. The cost of these trophies for take-home will, of course, have to be governed by the interest obtained from the fund.

It is her wish that the take-home trophies be engraved, and the expense of this engraving is born each year by the interest from her fund.

It is her wish that each year champagne be served at the conclusion of this event, and that the champagne be purchased by the interest from her fund.

It is her desire that the fund itself, the initial \$3,000.00 not be invaded.

At this point it is my recommendation to the Board of Directors that the \$3,000.00 be placed in one of these Savings and Loans funds that pays a very high rate of interest, which locks the money up for one, two or three years at a time, and that the interest from this money be placed in an ordinary pass book account of 5 1/4% as it is at the present time that can be invaded as the occasion arises. In other words, it is my suggestion that we have two separate accounts in this connection,





so as to increase the interest rate on the \$3,000.00 that we do not intend to invade.

A copy of this memorandum is being sent to Mrs. Wiman and to the Board of Directors, and I will keep a copy in the trophy book along with her deed.

This memorandum is subject to change pending hearing from Mrs. Wiman.
